Summary of 1998-1999 Rule Changes Affecting Aquatic Applicators

The following changes have been made to CEU requirements:

Aquatic Category – Beginning January 1, 2000, licensed applicators are required to have 16 continuing education units (CEUs) to renew the aquatic category. At least 8 of the 16 CEUs must be approved for the aquatic category, and at least 2 of the 16 CEUs must be approved for Core (general standards). The remaining 6 CEUs may be approved for either Core or the aquatic category.

Requirement for Core CEUs – Beginning January 1, 2000, all applicators must earn at least 2 different Core CEUs for each category in which licensed. The

same Core CEUs cannot count for multiple categories. For example: An applicator licensed in 3 categories must earn at least 6 Core CEUs to renew with CEUs.

Reminder: Renewing by Exam

All applicators have an option of taking the exams again to renew their license instead of earning CEUs. For applicators with more than one category, some categories may be renewed with CEUs and other categories by exam. If renewing by exam, the applicator must take the Core exam + category exams. If the applicator has earned at least 4 Core CEUs, it is not necssary to take the Core exam for renewal.

I. CALL TO ORDER

President Schardt called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

II. ROLL CALL AND MINUTES

Todd Olson took the roll and President Schardt declared a quorum. President Schardt asked if anyone had any deletions, omissions, or modifications to the minutes of the first quarter 2000 Board of Director's meeting. No changes were made and the minutes for the first quarter 2000 Board of Directors' Meeting passed unanimously.

III. CORRESPONDENCE

Two pieces of correspondence were discussed. The first correspondence was a March 3, 2000 email from Linda Nelson on behalf of APMS. She is the

chairperson for the Student Affairs Committee and asked if FAPMS would include the attached announcement for the 2000 student paper contest in a chapter newsletter. The contest will be held at the APMS annual conference in San Diego, California on July 16-17, 2000. The second correspondence was a letter to the FAPMS from the Southwest Florida Water Management District requesting FAPMS to pay for district employees attendance to the FAPMS annual meeting two years ago. President Schardt communicated with the district that FAPMS is not responsible for district employees attendance, rather that was a part of the agreement between the district and the department.

IV. NEW BUSINESS - Jeff Schardt

Outreach and education were discussed for about 45 minutes to determine FAPMS' role, what types of information to disperse, methods of outreach, and how FAPMS may need to adapt to sponsor outreach.

President Schardt opened the discussion with a question to the board asking if the FAPMS wished to become more involved in providing information to the general public. Dean Barber mentioned a recent FLDEP summit in which outreach was a major topic. He specifically pointed out that a video on the line of "National Geographic" or "Discovery Channel could help the outreach effort. President Schardt mentioned his update of the "Weed Alert" sheets and suggested that several agencies plus FAPMS have their logo on them. Steve Weinsier recommended that FAPMS take the lead role in outreach and seek endorsements from the agencies. His reason was the society would be able to expedite and tailor the outreach materials and programs to best suit FAPMS. He also mentioned a meeting he had with Steve Marshall with the FFWCC concerning outreach programs. Steve explained that Mr. Marshall was in charge of the FFWCC's education programs and was soliciting assistance for some aquatic planting at the Joe Budd Aquatic Education Center Marsh Sanctuary Project near Tallahassee. Steve recommended a donation be made to this project on behalf of FAPMS and a sign be posted on the site recognizing the donation.

President Schardt passed out copies of the February newsletter from CAST (Council for Agricultural Science and Technology) and summarized a conversation he had with Lars Anderson with USDA-ARS, Exotic and Invasive

Weed Research, University of California, Davis. Dr. Anderson told President Schardt that CAST involvement with invasive plants was influenced by APMS members on the CAST board. President Schardt pointed out some DEP information fliers and recommended including them on the FAPMS website. He also mentioned that the DEP has the funds to produce the fliers and as long as FAPMS approves of the content it may be wise to endorse them rather than duplicate them at a cost to FAPMS.

David Sutton mentioned that it might be a good idea to send a letter from the FAPMS President to organizations like National Geographic explaining FAPMS' position on outreach. Dean Barber mentioned collaborating with other societies (and agencies) to petition the nature shows and Nancy Allen suggested contacting Discovery Channel and Animal Planet as well.

President Schardt asked what the board thought of the FAPMS website and Dean Barber said it was a good start. Jackie Smith told the board about the website and how the server "Homestead" operated. She also submitted three pages of miscellaneous information about the website on behalf of Steve Smith. Jackie stated that Steve had not launched the website on the Worldwide Web because he had not received approval from FAPMS board to do so. Nancy Allen made a motion to approve the launching of the FAPMS website and for the board to endorse further development. Mike Baker offered a second on the motion and after some positive discussion it passed unanimously.

President Schardt asked the board what they thought about assembling a review team to check any information before it is posted on the website. President Schardt mentioned a committee could be formed to edit website material, or it could be done by a team under the Publicity Committee. After a brief discussion it was agreed to create a website review team led by the Publicity chairperson. Members of that team are Nancy Allen, Scott Glasscock, Judy Ludlow, Webmaster Steve Smith and Todd Olson.

Nancy Allen reported that she is out of FAPMS brochures after the last mailing to 500 DACS certified applicators. She is in the process of deciphering how many members joined due to that mailing. She suggested some editorial changes to the brochure before the next printing, and volunteered to take

charge of the project. President Schardt asked board members if they wanted to support the cost to print new brochures and how they could be used. A brief discussion ensued and it was determined that the FAPMS brochure could double as a membership and outreach tool. The format may be changed to a 8.5" X 11" tri-fold brochure to make it easier to photocopy. The website review team will work on the changes and report to the board at the 3Q meeting.

V. TREASURER'S REPORT - Steve Weinsier

The revised total income from the 23rd FAPMS Annual Meeting in Daytona Beach, FL was \$43,329.00 and the expenses were \$41,004.00 resulting in a profit of \$2,327.00. Next year's annual meeting registration will be computerized so tracking will be easier. Steve pointed out some certificates and forms in the board packet.

Steve reported that his balance sheet ending April 4, 2000 showed that the society's current assets were \$38,048.11 and liabilities at \$0.00. A breakdown of the total assets included a Nations Bank checking balance of \$10,058.29; a Nations Bank savings account balance of \$5,732.81, a Nations Bank CD account balance of \$10,293.00 and \$11,964.01 in the Strong Money Market Fund.

VI. EDITOR'S REPORT - Judy Ludlow

Judy received a call from Ken Langeland and he told her that he has many back issues of Aquatics magazine and would like to know what the board would like to do with them. She suggested sending some to the regional DEP offices for distribution and others to special events.

3. Awards - Jennifer Myers

Jennifer said she contacted the company that makes the awards and they are sending her a price update.

4. By-laws - Stephanie McCarty

A motion passed to accept the wording in the by-laws pertaining to the equipment demonstration at the annual meeting. A notice will appear in the next newsletter and it will be voted on by the general membership at the annual meeting in October

5. Financial - Jeff Schardt

No report was given.

6. Government Affairs - Don Doggett

Don summarized some of the ongoing lobbying by Chris Doolin (SePro's lobbyist). President Schardt mentioned a bill introduced to amend the homeowner muck/vegetation removal law from 50 feet or 50% (whichever is less) to a depth of three feet to a proposed rule that would allow homeowners to remove 100% of the vegetation and related muck. President Schardt said the money budgeted for aquatic plant control looks safe for this year, specifically \$10 million from the Solid Waste Management Trust Fund bringing this years total to \$15 million. Next year looks good for \$15 million and the year after the Florida Forever Fund will increase aquatic plant revenues to \$25 million.

7. Historical - Catherine Johnson

Catherine reported work on FAPMS history years 5-10 for eventual posting on the website. She asked for pictures from the "early years" and Steve Weinsier mentioned that Dr. Haller has boxes of information from those years.

8. Local Arrangements - David Farr

After a tour of the Sheraton Hotel Tampa East President Schardt asked the board if they were willing to discuss and vote on holding the FAPMS 2001 annual meeting at that location. A brief discussion ensued and a motion was made to accept the Sheraton Hotel Tampa East as the 2001 FAPMS annual meeting site on October 1-4, 2001. The motion passed unanimously. The 2000 FAPMS will be held in Cocoa Beach at the Holiday Inn on October 3-6, 2000. David asked for any suggestions for a meeting place for 2002, but no immediate recommendations were offered.

9. Mailing List - Jackie Smith

Jackie said she gave copies of the mailing list to the officers and offered copies to the rest of the attendees. She also talked about requests from several members to not sell lists with their names on them. Discussion ensued and the board felt that if members request to be deleted from the list they can by calling the mailing list coordinator.

10. Merchandising - Keshav Setaram

Keshav acknowledged Ron Hyatt for his hard work on the merchandising committee. He is also searching for new items for sale and will place an article in the next newsletter. He will have a cost analysis for the new items before the next board meeting. Steve Weinsier added his appreciation to the hard work that Keshav and Ron have put toward merchandising.

11. Nominating - Jim Brewer

Jim sent a letter to the board stating the nominating committee will start sorting through suggestions for nominees and present the slate to board at the 3Q 2000 meeting. The nominees will have their names published in the 3Q newsletter.

12. Past President's Advisory - Jim Brewer

No report was given.

13. Program - Cathy Widness

Cathy requested approval to mail a first call for papers. The board felt that was proper and the mailing will go out a.s.a.p. President Schardt asked how the search for the keynote speaker was going and several names were offered to Cathy for consideration.

14. Publicity - Nancy Allen

Nancy reported that 106 Plant I.D. charts were sold and also shared her new mailing address which is; 602 N. Palm Ave. Palatka, FL 32177.

15. Resource Demonstration - Steve Smith

Jackie Smith reported for Steve that the park next to the Holiday Inn required a permit for using it and FAPMS must provide security for the event. Steve is still checking on the particulars concerning this matter. Jackie brought up the point of how much should be charged for the demo. only and who should pay? A discussion ensued about this topic and Nancy Allen moved to set the fee at \$150 for private companies who choose to demo., but not pay for booth space. The motion got a second and it passed 6 to 5.

16. Scholarship - Brian Nelson

Brian reported due dates for scholarships and mentioned an article that he would put together for the next newsletter. He also reported a change in the applicator educational assistance program to a minimum one year membership requirement.

17. Vendor - Michael Owen

No report was given.

VIII. OLD BUSINESS

President Schardt opened discussion concerning the presentation David Tarver made on behalf of the Inter Mountain Ag. Foundation. The board discussed donating \$1,000 to support the foundation to receive videotapes and printed material. Several board members volunteered to present the program to teachers and get their reaction. Reports will be furnished at the next board meeting.





SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

The Florida Aquatic Plant Management Society Scholarship And Research Foundation Inc. Anounces the availability of the following scholarships.

FAPMS DEPENDENT SCHOLARSHIP—provides a \$1,000 to \$1,500 scholarship to a deserving dependent of a FAPMS member. The scholarship is based on:

- 1. The applicant's parent or guardian having been a FAPMS member in good standing for at least three (3) consecutive years.
- 2. Financial need as determined by the application.
- 3. The applicant being a high school senior entering college the next academic year, attending junior college or be a college undergraduate.
- 4. An evaluation of the quality of the application and required essay by the Scholarship Selection committee composed of three FAPMS members and four Scholarship Foundation members.
- 5. Submission of a completed application by June 15, 2000.

GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP (William L. Maier Jr. Scholarship)—provides up to \$1,500 to a deserving graduate student who is:

- 1. Enrolled in an accredited Florida University or College.
- 2. A U.S. citizen.
- 3. Majoring in a field of study directly related to the management of aquatic vegetation for the ecological benefit of aquatic and wetland habits.
- 4. The quality of the application and required 500-1000 word essay as determined by the Scholarship Foundation's Board of Directors.
- 5. Submission of a completed application by August 1, 2000.

APPLICATOR EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM-provides up to fifty percent reimbursement of tuition costs for eligible FAPMS members who:

1. Work "full time" in the aquatic plant management profession as determined by the FAPMS Scholarship and Research Foundation

- Board of Directors and are attending college, community college or vocational/technical school to further their educational goals.
- 2. Have been a FAPMS member in good standing for at least one year.
- 3. Have paid tuition receipts to submit for reimbursement.
- 4. Submit a completed application between August 15 and September 15, 2000 for the previous year. The program year will run from August 1 to July 31 of each year.
- 5. Assistance will be awarded on a pro-rated basis by dividing the amount of funds available by the total amount of eligible tuition costs submitted by all applicants. For example, if the Board approves \$1,000 for the program and \$4,000 of tuition receipts are submitted each applicant would be reimbursed 25% of their tuition costs.
