

Recent Court Ruling May Affect Use of Aquatic Herbicides

Several special interest groups in the state of Washington represented by Earthjustice filed suit against the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in January 2001. The group claimed EPA failed to consult with the appropriate federal agencies regarding the potential impact of 54 herbicides on endangered salmon and thereby violated the Endangered Species Act (ESA). In July 2002, a federal judge ruled that EPA was in violation of the ESA because they did not consult with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA-Fisheries) or US Fish and Wildlife Service. The EPA was ordered by the court in July 2002 to consult with NOAA-Fisheries to evaluate the potential impact of the 54 pesticides and to determine what restrictions should be imposed to protect salmon. In November 2002, Earthjustice requested the court to order the implementation of buffer zones for applications of the pesticides near streams and water bodies accessible to salmon. In August 2003, the court instructed EPA and industry representatives to negotiate which of the 54 pesticides should require interim measures. In December 2003, the court directed Earthjustice to draft proposed language for a final order for the interim measures. The court issued a final order in January 2004. This order requires any of the 54 pesticides that have not been reviewed by EPA or have been determined as "likely to adversely affect" salmonoids to be subject to buffer zones. The order requires buffer zone widths to be set at 20 yards for ground applications and 100 yards for aerial applications of pesticides and are applied near all streams. lakes, estuaries and other water bodies where salmon inhabit.

The direct result of the lawsuit and court order

has affected the application of pesticides near surface waters in Washington, Oregon and California. Other special interest groups are filing suits across the nation using the same rationale to protect other endangered species. This ruling may also impact the nation's ability to use many EPA-approved aquatic herbicides and thereby affect the management of invasive aquatic weeds in many states including Florida.

The Aquatic Plant Management Society (APMS) is working with Responsible Industry for a Sound Environment (RISE) in supporting regulations that help EPA to protect the environment and endangered species without unnecessary legal procedures and potential judgments against aquatic plant management operations. These organizations are supporting the draft Endangered Species Counterpart Regulation published in the Federal Register January 30, 2004. The proposed rule will help streamline the EPA's pesticide regulatory program and bring it into compliance with requirements of the ESA. The Endangered Species Counterpart Regulation will establish a clear regulatory framework for compliance with ESA consultation requirements. Currently, the comment period is open on this regulation. I. CALL TO ORDER

Secretary Angie Huebner called the meeting to order at 10:04am on January 28, 2004.

II. ROLL CALL AND MINUTES

Angie Huebner took the roll and President Weinsier declared a quorum. President Weinsier asked if there were any deletions, omissions or modifications that should be made to the Fourth Quarter 2003 Board of Directors Meeting minutes. Vicki Pontius made a motion to accept the minutes for the Fourth Quarter 2003 Board of Directors Meeting and Steve Smith seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimouslv.

III. CORRESPONDENCE

President Weinsier provided a FAPMS Presidential Editorial that identified potential goals for the Society during 2004. These goals include to maintain existing members by better communicating with the general membership, increase society benefits that attract new members, provide more educational outreach and in-

crease the number of student members, establish partnerships with other organizations, increase member participation in committees, increase FAPMS participation in community events and improve communication with legislators. Steve asked for suggestions to accomplish the goals. David Farr suggested creating regional working groups that would provide presentations and training courses regarding aquatic plant management. There was a lengthy discussion about the possibility of FAPMS and South Florida Aquatic Plant Management Society having joint meetings and establishing a partnership. Jennifer Bustos-Fitz, president of the South Florida Aquatic Plant Management Society will address the aforementioned issues with the board of directors. There was a lengthy discussion about FAPMS approaching other organizations to have joint concurrent meetings. Keshav Setaram will approach the Florida Lake Management Society regarding conducting a joint meeting in the future. There was some concern about losing the focus of the Society if joint meetings were conducted with other organizations. Two memos were submitted regarding scholarship donations. A memo provided by President Weinsier for the request for letters from Regional Chapters to support Jeff Schardt's nomination to the National Invasive Species Advisory Committee was submitted. A letter from the president of the Aquatic Plant Management Society to the Executive Director of the National Invasive Species Council nominating Jeff Schardt to serve on the Invasive Species Advisory Committee was submitted. President Weinsier commented the memos regarding the scholarship donations and the nominations for the invasive species committee should be discussed during old business.

IV. TREASURER'S REPORT-David Farr

David provided a profit and loss statement for the Society for January-December 2003. He also reported the Society's financial report/status can be acquired on the FAPMS website. David reported the Society's total current assets are \$41,248.87. A breakdown of total assets includes: checking-\$3,066.33; savings-\$20,973.78; Strong Money Market-\$13,382.04; inventory and fixed assets-\$3,826.72. David provided a summary for income and expenses for the 2003 training conference. Total income including registration and sponsorship was \$43,245.00 and total expenses were \$36,661.60. The Society's total income for 2003 was \$55,368.85 that included membership fees, merchandise sales, newsletter advertising, interest and funds remaining from 2002. The total expenses were \$50,429.42. David reported he has scheduled an appointment with an accountant on February 3, 2004 and the Society's taxes will be completed in February. The sales tax for July 2003-December 2003 was \$166.42. David upgraded the Society's web subscription. This upgrade provides more pages at a cost of \$64.04. An online store has been added to the website. David purchased a copy of Adobe Acrobat Professional. David asked for suggestions and comments regarding the FAPMS website. Steve commented the Society should complete a budget for the year and previous year's expenditures could be used as a guideline. David stated his goal is to have enough money in liquid assets by January 2006 to pay for the following years annual training conference.

V. SECRETARY'S REPORT-Angie Huebner

Angie provided a copy of the officers, directors and committee chairs contact information sheet for review. She asked everyone to review and provide corrections.

VI. EDITIOR'S REPORT-Judy Ludlow

Judy was not present at the meeting however provided a report via email. President Weinsier read Judy's report. Judy has decided this year will be the last year she will serve as editor. She contacted several individuals to determine if they would be interested in serving as editor for the Society, however these individuals were not interested in the position. Steve Smith made a motion to accept the treasurer's, secretary's and editor's reports. Todd Olson seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously. There was a discussion about the editor's position and duties and the requirements to serve as editor. President Weinsier contacted Karen Brown, who is the editor for the Florida Exotic Pest Plant Council (FLEPPC), to determine if she was interested in being the editor for the Society. Karen said she would give it some thought. President Weinsier stated FLEPPC is now publishing Wildland Weeds in-house and it has proved to be beneficial to the organization. Jackie Smith suggested inviting Karen Brown to the next board of directors meeting to discuss the process of publishing Wildland Weeds. Steve Weinsier commented he knows an individual that may be interested in serving as editor however the individual has not met the requirements for the position. Jennifer Bustos-Fitz has met the requirements to serve as editor. She volunteered to serve as editor and to work with the individual to publish Aquatics. It was suggested that Jennifer should be nominated to serve as editor for 2005.

President Weinsier stated he has received some negative feedback regarding the location of this year's conference. The conference location for 2005 was discussed briefly. Members of the board suggested having the 2005 conference at Cocoa Beach, St. Petersburg or Daytona Beach. Members of the board suggested having the next board of director's meeting at St. Petersburg to view the facilities.

8. MAILING LIST-Jackie Smith

Jackie reported she needs the names and addresses of members to be added to the mailing list from David Farr. David will send the information to Jackie as soon as possible. President Weinsier stated an individual has requested a copy of the mailing list. It was decided at the 3rd quarter BOD meeting to sell the membership list for \$500. Once the payment has been received, the membership list will be sent to the individual.

9. MERCHANDISING-Jackie Smith

No report was given. There was a discussion about providing a registration gift for the Aquatic Plant Management Society (APMS) annual meeting at Tampa in July. PJ Myers made a motion that FAPMS provide a registration gift for the APMS annual meeting. The motion received a second from Vicki Pontius. The motion passed unanimously. Suggestions for the registration gift included a Tshirt or clipboard. Jackie will acquire prices and provide the board estimates at the next quarterly meeting.

Vicki Pontius commented Laura Powell would probably assist with acquiring the CEUs.
