As of February 1, 2004, any type of biocontrol agent brought into the port of entry goes through customs and has to be transported via bonded courier to an Animal Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) facility. The transport of the materials is very costly. An alternative to the method may be to designate a quarantine officer for each facility who would transport the materials. This alternative has not been approved by APHIS at this time.

Having a joint meeting with FLMS is still a possibility. The local arrangements committees from both FLMS and FAPMS should discuss the requirements of each organization to determine if it is feasible to have a joint meeting. Don Doggett also suggested having a joint meeting with the APMS.

tended the meeting in order to inform the BOD about the production of Wildland Weeds. Karen explained and provided a report for the BOD review. Wildland Weeds was previously published by a contractor. When the contract was up for renewal, FLEPPC decided to publish the magazine independently so the Council could acquire any profits generated. A printer, graphic design company and local mailing service were selected to complete the magazine. Acquiring articles for the magazine has not been a problem. Mail-in cards, meeting registration forms, CDs and other articles have been inserted in the magazine. Karen has an editorial committee that consists of members that are experienced in chemical and biological controls, botany and the FLEPPC chair. The appropriate committee member reviews the submitted articles. Karen commented the advertisement section involves the most work because of the variety of advertisement materials received from various companies. Karen prepares invoices for the advertisements and provides the Treasurer copies. Payments are sent directly to the Treasurer. FLEPPC has profited on almost every issue of Wildland Weeds. After expenses, FLEPPC profited \$1500 on each of the last two issues of the magazine. Karen commented there have been no drawbacks but the magazine requires a lot of editing both content and style and requires extreme attention to detail and a signifi-Karen commented that cant amount of time. FLEPPC sends Wildland Weeds to members of the Southeast Exotic Pest Plant Council (SEEPPC). SEEPPC pays FLEPPC \$5 per member for the subscription.

David Tarver, publisher for Aquatics for FAPMS, explained and provided a report to inform the BOD about the production of Aquatics. David explained the history of the Aquatics magazine. He also explained the publication process. The Aquatics magazine usually varies from 20-24 pages, all color and is printed four times a year. Approximately 2,400 copies are printed for each issue. The advertisement space never exceeds 50% and is usually 35-40%. Text layout often takes several weeks and requires several edits and reviews. After the magazine is printed, a mail master company distributes it. The magazine is distributed to seven APMS Chapters. Members of the chapters receive Aquatics free of charge. David suggested charging a subscription fee to the other chapters to help with the cost of the magazine. The profit from Aquatics has varied over the years from nearly zero to providing an hourly wage of approximately \$10-13 after expenses. The work hours required per quarterly issue also varies but probably averages 110-150 hours. David commented a couple of directors discussed the possibility of combining Wildland Weeds and Aquatics. David advised against combining the two magazines because the areas are very different and require their own support and identity.

There was a discussion regarding library subscriptions for the magazines. FLEPPC is offering a gift subscription for local libraries for \$15. This is an effort to provide information for residents.

Bill Haller commented it may not be feasible to acquire a subscription fee for the cost of Aquatics from the other chapters. President Weinsier commented the BOD should provide input to the Editor regarding the type of information they would like to see placed in Aquatics. He also commented the BOD should be more active in acquiring advertisements and articles for the magazine. David Farr suggested acquiring an article from each APMS chapter for each issue of Aquatics. David Tarver suggested that President Weinsier meet with the other chapter presidents to discuss this issue. There was a discussion about nominating an editor. At the last meeting, it was recommended that Jennifer Bustos-Fitz be placed on the candidate slate for 2005 for the editor position.


