## **A Letter From The President**

This year a proposal for funding was received by FAPMS from The University IFAS Extension, Center for Aquatic and Invasive Plants (CAIP). In addition to the yearly request for sponsorship of the Plant Camp field trip, we were also given the opportunity to help several critical educational projects. By a unanimous vote the board voted to fund the following projects.

- Enhanced support for the Plant Camp Aquatic Plant Field Day. This includes a meal, airboat costs, charter bus costs, and incidentals. The Plant Camp has been instrumental in educating teachers on the issues surrounding invasive aquatic plants.
- Correlate the Center's invasive curricula with national Common Core Standards. This will enable teachers to use the invasive species curricula developed by the Center to meet national and state standards, thus increasing exposure to outreach educational materials.
- 3) Finally FAPMS is sponsoring 5 school events for the CAIP's Lakeville project. For those of you who were not able to attend last year's demonstration of this project at the FAPMS 2012 4th quarter board meeting it is an excellent educational program designed for school children, which addresses many of the important issue surrounding aquatic and invasive plant control.

A complete demonstration and explanation of these programs is currently being planned for next year's FAPMS meeting in October. This is a great opportunity to see your FAPMS money at work to further our educational outreach. Thanks to everyone involved.

Paul C. Myers Applicator Dependent Scholarship-Provides up to \$1500 to deserving dependents of FAPMS members. The scholarship is based on:

- 1. The applicant's parent or guardian having been a FAPMS member in good standing for at least three consecutive years.
- 2. Financial need. Will be determined based on need and the expected family contribution amount indicated on the processing results of a Student Aid Report (OMB No. 1845-0008). This report is available by completing a Free Application for Federal Student Aid Federal Form (go to www.fafsa.gov).
- 3. The applicant being a high school senior entering college the next academic year, attending junior college, or being a college undergraduate.
- 4. An evaluation of the quality of the application and required essay by the scholarship selection committee composed of three FAPMS members and four FAPMS Scholarship and Research Foundation members.
