The Invasive Plant Management Section received an additional \$2.5 million from the legislature to be used in our Upland plant management program. This will increase the overall Section budget by that amount. Dean Jones asked about the Aquatic budget.

Staff are actively developing Legislative Budget Requests for the 24/25 fiscal year and are proposing increases in the upland and aquatic plant management programs.

VIC RAMEY PHOTO CONTEST



- Prizes this year are first \$150.00, Second \$100.00, And third place \$50.00 For each category.

Photos are judged on category relevance (40%), creativity or artistic impression (40%), composition and arrangement (10%), and focus and sharpness (10%). Judges are selected from attending conference members. Photo entries may be submitted at the registration desk or placed on the designated table.
